	הִיָּה וּמוֹלֶדֶתָּ אֲשֶׁר הוֹלֵדְתָּ אֶחָדֵיהֶם לְךָ יִהְיֶה hebrew The word הִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 עַל שֵׁם אֲחֵיהֶם יִקְרָאוּ בְּנֵהֶלְתָּם
ESV	And the children that you fathered after them shall be yours. They shall be called by the name of their brothers in their inheritance.
NIV	Any children born to you after them will be yours; in the territory they inherit they will be reckoned under the names of their brothers.
NLT	But any children born to you in the future will be your own, and they will inherit land within the territories of their brothers Ephraim and Manasseh.

	τὰplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ greek The definite article δὲplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἔκγονα ἃ ἐὰν γεννήσῃς μετὰ ταῦταplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὔτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun. οὔτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 σοὶ ἔσονταιplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). LXX It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐπὶ τῷplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ greek The definite article ὀνόματι τῶνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ greek The definite article ἀδελφῶν αὐτῶνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
