The sense of  $\pi\alpha\zeta$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

lt an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐπὶ τῆςplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip\_bigὁ
