	יהוה? plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
