NIV	'Who of you is left who saw this house in its former glory? How does it look to you now? Does it not seem to you like nothing?
NLT	'Does anyone remember this house- this Temple- in its former splendor? How, in comparison, does it look to you now? It must seem like nothing at all!

It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὃς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning εἶδεν τὸν greek Meaning: * The The definite article.
