ESV	Strangers devour his strength, and he knows it not; gray hairs are sprinkled upon him, and he knows it not.
NIV	Foreigners sap his strength, but he does not realize it. His hair is sprinkled with gray, but he does not notice.
NLT	Worshiping foreign gods has sapped their strength, but they don't even know it. Their hair is gray, but they don't realize they're old and weak.
