Hebrew	The word הִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בְּיוֹם הַהוּא יִהְיֶה יְהוָה יִצְקֶב וַיִּמְשְׁכֶן בְּשָׂרוֹ יִהְיֶה כְבוֹד יִצְקֶב וַיִּמְשְׁכֶן בְּשָׂרוֹ יִהְיֶה
ESV	And in that day the glory of Jacob will be brought low, and the fat of his flesh will grow lean.
NIV	“In that day the glory of Jacob will fade; the fat of his body will waste away.

	ἔσταιplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigείμι greek είμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
