	הִיְהִי plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הִיְהִי hebrew The word הִיְהִי means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. ESV	And on every lofty mountain and every high hill there will be brooks running with water, in the day of the great slaughter, when the towers fall.
NIV	In the day of great slaughter, when the towers fall, streams of water will flow on every high mountain and every lofty hill.
NLT	In that day, when your enemies are slaughtered and the towers fall, there will be streams of water flowing down every mountain and hill.
