	Usage in the New Testament
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 συναγωγὴν ὕδατος
KJV	I have digged, and drunk water; and with the sole of my feet have I dried up all the rivers of the besieged places.
