	וְהָיָה וְהָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לְצִלַּיּוֹם מִחֹרֶב וּלְמַחְסָה וּלְמִסְתָּוֶר מִזֶּרֶם וּמִמְּטָר
ESV	There will be a booth for shade by day from the heat, and for a refuge and a shelter from the storm and rain.
NIV	It will be a shelter and shade from the heat of the day, and a refuge and hiding place from the storm and rain.
NLT	It will be a shelter from daytime heat and a hiding place from storms and rain.

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. εἰς σκιάν ἀπὸ καύματος καὶplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί
