Hebrew	Meanings: * God * god * goddess * divine ones * angels Noun, masculine
ESV	They are turned back and utterly put to shame, who trust in carved idols, who say to metal images, “You are our gods.”
NIV	But those who trust in idols, who say to images, 'You are our gods,' will be turned back in utter shame.
NLT	But those who trust in idols, who say, 'You are our gods,' will be turned away in shame.

LXX	αὐτοῖplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) δέplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. θεοὶplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεὸς greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God ἡμῶν
