ESV	Therefore my people shall know my name. Therefore in that day they shall know that it is I who speak; here am I.”
NIV	Therefore my people will know my name; therefore in that day they will know that it is I who foretold it. Yes, it is I.”
NLT	But I will reveal my name to my people, and they will come to know its power. Then at last they will recognize that I am the one who speaks to them.”

	Preposition that relates to movement through space, time, means or cause - it's a preposition of movement and mediation.

	Meaning:
	* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it
	Demonstrative pronoun.
	οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 γινώσεται ὁplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

	The definite article λαός μου τὸplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ
	greek
	The definite article ὄνομά μου ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν
	greek
	Preposition meaning “in”. τῇplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ
	greek
	The definite article ἡμέρᾱ ἐκείνῃ ὅτι ἐγὼ εἰμιplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί
	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. αὐτὸςplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

	Meaning
	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
