	The word אֶבֶץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. $\gamma \tilde{\eta}$ plugin-autotooltip default plugin-autotooltip big $\gamma \tilde{\eta}$

Meaning:

* Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5)

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words "ground", "geometry" and "geology".

It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 ὑποπόδιον τῶνρlugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip bigò
