	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. καθ’ ἑαυτήν.
NIV	So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
NLT	In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.
KJV	So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless.
	Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.

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
