	ἀλλ' ἐρεῖ τις, σὺ πίστιν ἔχεις ἀγὰρ ἔργα ἔχω. δεῖξόν μοι τὴν greek The definite article πίστιν σου χωρὶς greek Meaning: * Separately * Apart from * Without * Independently of Adverb or preposition (taking the genitive case) that expressing exclusion or lack of association between two things. Occurs 41 times in the New Testament. Greek Biblical Examples John 15:5Hebrews 9:22James 2:26Matthew 13:34 τῶν greek The definite article ἔργων, ἀγὰρ σοι δείξω ἐκ τῶν greek The definite article ἔργων μου τὴν greek The definite article πίστιν.
ESV	But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works.
NIV	But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by what I do.
NLT	Now someone may argue, "Some people have faith; others have good deeds." But I say, "How can you show me your faith if you don't have good deeds? I will show you my faith by my good deeds."
KJV	Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works.
