Behold, the wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, are crying out against you, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts.

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- You have lived on the earth in luxury and in self-indulgence. You have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter.
- 6 You have condemned; you have murdered the righteous person. He does not resist you.
- Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains.
- 8 You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.
- Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door.
- As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.
- Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.
- But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.
- 13 Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise.
- ls anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.
- And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.
- Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.
- Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth.
- 18 Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.
- 19 My brothers, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and someone brings him back,
- let him know that whoever brings back a sinner from his wandering will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

- 1 Now listen, you rich people, weep and wail because of the misery that is coming upon you.
- 2 Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your clothes.

- 9 Don't grumble against each other, brothers, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!
- Brothers, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.
- As you know, we consider blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy.

- Above all, my brothers, do not swear-not by heaven or by earth or by anything else. Let your "Yes" be yes, and your "No," no, or you will be condemned.
- 13 Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise.
- Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord.
- And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven.
- Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.
- Elijah was a man just like us. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years.
- 18 Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.
- 19 My brothers, if one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring him back,
- remember this: Whoever turns a sinner from the error of his way will save him from death and cover over a multitude of sins.

- Look here, you rich people: Weep and groan with anguish because of all the terrible troubles ahead of you.

- For examples of patience in suffering, dear brothers and sisters, look at the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.
- We give great honor to those who endure under suffering. For instance, you know about Job, a man of great endurance. You can see how the Lord was kind to him at the end, for the Lord is full of tenderness and mercy.
- But most of all, my brothers and sisters, never take an oath, by heaven or earth or anything else. Just say a simple yes or no, so that you will not sin and be condemned.
- Are any of you suffering hardships? You should pray. Are any of you happy? You should sing praises.
- Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders of the church to come and pray over you, anointing you with oil in the name of the Lord.
- Such a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick, and the Lord will make you well. And if you have committed any sins, you will be forgiven.
- Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results.

- 18 Then, when he prayed again, the sky sent down rain and the earth began to yield its crops.
