Hebrew	יהוה יִהְיֶה עִמָּךְ וְלֹא תִירָא מִפְּנֵיהֶם כִּי אֲתֵתְךָ אֲנִי לְהַצִּלְךָ נָא יְהוָה hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament. First appearing in Genesis 2:4, it occurs over 6,000 times in the Old Testament. 	ESV Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the LORD.”
	NIV Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you,” declares the LORD.
	NLT And don't be afraid of the people, for I will be with you and will protect you. I, the LORD, have spoken!”
	μὴ φοβηθῆς ἀπὸ προσώπου αὐτῶν greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ὅτι μετὰ σοῦ ἐγὼ εἰμι greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τοῦ The definite article
KJV	Be not afraid of their faces: for I am with thee to deliver thee, saith the LORD.
