The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

It is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning [ἐλάλησεν ἐφ' ὑμᾶς οἶκος Ισραηλ](#)

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
