lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word אַהְּהְ (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

The Hebrew אַת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article מָּבְיָי הַבְּּלְית הַיִּאֹת 1.1 Genesis 1:
