	hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by אֱלֹהִים (יוֹשְׁבֵי הָעִיר הַזֹּאת וְאֶת plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big
