ESV	A voice on the bare heights is heard, the weeping and pleading of Israel's sons because they have perverted their way; they have forgotten the LORD their God.
NIV	A cry is heard on the barren heights, the weeping and pleading of the people of Israel, because they have perverted their ways and have forgotten the LORD their God.
NLT	Voices are heard high on the windswept mountains, the weeping and pleading of Israel's people. For they have chosen crooked paths and have forgotten the LORD their God.

IT is most frequently translated as “and” δεήσεως υἱῶν Ἰσραὴλ ὅτι ἠδίκησαν ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ταῖς greek The definite article ὁδοῖς αὐτῶν greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive).
