Hebrew	The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרָא אֱלֹהִים (מִצּוֹת אֲבִיהֶם אֲשֶׁר צִוּם וְהָעַם הַזֶּה לֹא שָׁמְעוּ אֵלַי
ESV	The sons of Jonadab the son of Rechab have kept the command that their father gave them, but this people has not obeyed me.
NIV	The descendants of Jonadab son of Recab have carried out the command their forefather gave them, but these people have not obeyed me.'
NLT	The descendants of Jehonadab son of Recab have obeyed their ancestor completely, but you have refused to listen to me.'

When used with the genitive case, διά emphasizes the means or channel by which something happens. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.
