λόγος in Greek Thought

Before the New Testament, λόγος already had deep philosophical use. In Greek philosophy, λόγος was the rational principle that ordered the universe, the divine reason that structured all things. The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is

countable or uncountable.
