	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” πάντας plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big νάς

	Usage in the New Testament
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

	Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ λουδαίους τοὺς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ὁ, ἡ, τό
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	Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ ὄντας plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί
	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. μετ αὐτοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big αὐτός

	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
