Hebrew	The Hebrew אתָּ word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. Genesis 1:1 שָׁמַעוּ רָפוּ יְדֵינוּ צָרָה הַחֲזִיקָתָנוּ חֵיל כִּי־לֵדָה
ESV	We have heard the report of it; our hands fall helpless; anguish has taken hold of us, pain as of a woman in labor.
NIV	We have heard reports about them, and our hands hang limp. Anguish has gripped us, pain like that of a woman in labor.
NLT	We have heard reports about the enemy, and we wring our hands in fright. Pangs of anguish have gripped us, like those of a woman in labor.
