	הָיָה לְרֵעִהּ אֶתְחַקּ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigהָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 קָרָא לְאֱלֹהִים וַיַּעֲנֵהוּ שְׁחֹק צְדִיק תִּמְיִם
ESV	I am a laughingstock to my friends; I, who called to God and he answered me, a just and blameless man, am a laughingstock.
NIV	“I have become a laughingstock to my friends, though I called upon God and he answered- a mere laughingstock, though righteous and blameless!
NLT	Yet my friends laugh at me, for I call on God and expect an answer. I am a just and blameless man, yet they laugh at me.
LXX	δίκαιος γὰρ ἀνὴρ καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἄμεμπτος ἐγενήθη εἰς χλεύασμα
KJV	I am as one mocked of his neighbour, who calleth upon God, and he answereth him: the just upright man is laughed to scorn.

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
