NLT	If only you could be silent! That's the wisest thing you could do.
	εἴηplugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").
LXX	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. δὲplugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigδέ

	δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ὑμῖν κωφεῦσαι καὶρlugin-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί

	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" ἀποβήσεται ὑμῖν εἰς σοφίαν
