	הִיְהִי plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הִיְהִי hebrew The word הִיְהִי means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לָכֵן לְהַכְמִיָּה
ESV	Oh that you would keep silent, and it would be your wisdom!
NIV	If only you would be altogether silent! For you, that would be wisdom.
NLT	If only you could be silent! That's the wisest thing you could do.
LXX	εἴμην plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἴμην greek εἴμην is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἴμην is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. δὲ δὲ greek δὲ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ὑμῖν κωφεῦσθαι καὶ καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀποβήσεται ὑμῖν εἰς σοφίαν
KJV	O that ye would altogether hold your peace! and it should be your wisdom.

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
