	* Wind * Breath * Spirit
	Noun. Occurs about 380 times in the Old Testament. Though usually feminine, רוּחַ sometimes takes masculine verbs and adjectives, especially when referring to the Spirit of God (רוּחַ יְהוָה). Exodus 10:13 Genesis 6:17 Genesis 41:8 Proverbs 16:32 Ecclesiastes 12:7 Genesis 1:2 Judges 3:10 Ezekiel 36:27 Genesis 2:7 John 3:8 Genesis 1:2 Genesis 8:1 אֲזַי מַה יִּמְרִיצֶךָ כִּי תַעֲנֶה
ESV	Shall windy words have an end? Or what provokes you that you answer?
NIV	Will your long-winded speeches never end? What ails you that you keep on arguing?
NLT	Won't you ever stop blowing hot air? What makes you keep on talking?
LXX	τί γάρ μὴ τάξις ἐστὶν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί
	greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ῥήμασιν πνεύματος ἡ τί παρενοχλήσει σοι ὅτι ἀποκρίνη
KJV	Shall vain words have an end? or what emboldeneth thee that thou answerest?
