	הָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 כָּעֵלֶּלִים לֹא רָאוּ אֹר
ESV	Or why was I not as a hidden stillborn child, as infants who never see the light?
NIV	Or why was I not hidden in the ground like a stillborn child, like an infant who never saw the light of day?
NLT	Why wasn't I buried like a stillborn child, like a baby who never lives to see the light?
LXX	ὃ ὥσπερ ἔκτρωμα ἐκπορευόμενον ἐκ μήτρας μητρὸς ἢ ὥσπερ νήπιος οἷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big greek Meaning: * Who * Which * What The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent). It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning οὐκ εἶδον φῶς
KJV	Or as an hidden untimely birth I had not been; as infants which never saw light.
