Hebrew	לִמְס מִרְעָהוּ חֶסֶד וְיִרְאַת שְׁדַי יַעֲזֹב
ESV	"He who withholds kindness from a friend forsakes the fear of the Almighty.
NIV	"A despairing man should have the devotion of his friends, even though he forsakes the fear of the Almighty.
NLT	"One should be kind to a fainting friend, but you accuse me without any fear of the Almighty.
LXX	ἀπείπατό με ἔλεος ἐπισκοπὴ δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. κυρίου ὑπερεῖδέν με
KJV	To him that is afflicted pity should be shewed from his friend; but he forsaketh the fear of the Almighty.
