	Preposition meaning “in”. ἐαυτῷ ἔρχεται εἰς τὸ
	greek
	The definite article μνημεῖον· ἥν
	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. δὲ
	greek
	δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. σπήλαιον, καὶ
	greek
	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” λίθος ἐπέκειτο ἐπ’ αὐτῷ.
	greek
	Meaning
	* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same
	Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.
	Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
	ESV Then Jesus, deeply moved again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it.
NIV	Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance.
NLT	Jesus was still angry as he arrived at the tomb, a cave with a stone rolled across its entrance.
KJV	Jesus therefore again groaning in himself cometh to the grave. It was a cave, and a stone lay upon it.
