	Demonstrative pronoun.	
	οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 εἰπὼν φωνῇ μεγάλῃ ἐκράυγασεν· Λάζαρε, δεῦρο ἕξω.	
ESV	When he had said these things, he cried out with a loud voice, “Lazarus, come out.”	
NIV	When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, “Lazarus, come out!”	
NLT	Then Jesus shouted, “Lazarus, come out!”	
KJV	And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, Lazarus, come forth.	

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
