It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τοῦ greek The definite article κόσμου τούτου greek Meaning: * These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it Demonstrative pronoun.
