IT is most frequently translated as “and” καλῶς λέγετε· εἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. γάρ.
ESV	You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am.

NIV	"You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am.
NLT	You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and you are right, because that's what I am.
KJV	Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am.
