	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐὰν ποιῇτεplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigποιέω
	Meaning: * To do * To make This verb - to do or make - is used in connection with a large range of activities including creation, covenant formation, obedience, miracles, sin and worship. Verb forms Present tense Person Greek Form ἃ ἐγὼ ἐντέλλομαι ὑμῖν.
ESV	You are my friends if you do what I command you.
