IT is most frequently translated as “and” λήμψεσθε, ἵνα ᾔ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ χάρα ὑμῶν ἥ greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. πεπληρωμένη.
ESV	Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.
NIV	Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete.

NLT	You haven't done this before. Ask, using my name, and you will receive, and you will have abundant joy.
KJV	Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full.
