Meaning

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ὑμεῖς
μοι μαρτυρεῖτε ὅτι εἶπον· οὐκ εἰμὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example
εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐγὼ ὅ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ὁ

greek

The definite article Χριστός, plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big Χριστός

Christ means “anointed one”

The equivalent Hebrew word is Messiah (מָשִׁיחַ)

Noun, masculine. ἀλλ’ ὅτι ἀπεσταλμένος εἰμὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί
