The definite article Γαλιλαίας εἶ

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐράυνησον καὶ

The definite article Γαλιλαίας οὐκ ἐγείρεται.

ESV	They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and see that no prophet arises from Galilee." [THE EARLIEST MANUSCRIPTS DO NOT INCLUDE JOHN 7:53-8:11]
NIV	They replied, "Are you from Galilee, too? Look into it, and you will find that a prophet does not come out of Galilee."
NLT	They replied, "Are you from Galilee, too? Search the Scriptures and see for yourself- no prophet ever comes from Galilee!"
KJV	They answered and said unto him, Art thou also of Galilee? Search, and look: for out of Galilee ariseth no prophet.

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
