Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

εἶ; plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἶμί

εἶμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. εἶπεν αὐτοῖς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

* Beginning * First * Elementary * Rulers, rule, domain

Noun, feminine (first declension)

Occurs 56 times in the New Testament, consistently conveying the idea of primacy - whether temporal (i.e. the start, e.g. John 1:1) or causal (i.e. the source) or governmental (i.e. the ruler, e.g. Ephesians 6:12 ὁ τι καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" [λαλῶ ὑμῖν](#).

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
