	The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 עַל הַשְּׁבוּעֶה אֻשֶּׁר נִּשְׁבֵּענוּ
ESV	This we will do to them: let them live, lest wrath be upon us, because of the oath that we swore to them."
NIV	This is what we will do to them: We will let them live, so that wrath will not fall on us for breaking the oath we swore to them."
NLT	This is what we must do. We must let them live, for divine anger would come upon us if we broke our oath.
