	הָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. Hebrew * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 הָיָה יִשְׂרָאֵל וַיֵּשֶׁב אֶת plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big את hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרָא אֱלֹהִים (הָכֵנְעִי לְמַסּ וְהוֹרִישׁ לֹא הוֹרִישׁוּ
ESV	When Israel grew strong, they put the Canaanites to forced labor, but did not drive them out completely.
NIV	When Israel became strong, they pressed the Canaanites into forced labor but never drove them out completely.
NLT	When the Israelites grew stronger, they forced the Canaanites to work as slaves, but they never did drive them completely out of the land.
