Occurs over 250 times in the Old Testament. From the root קָרַב, meaning “to come near, approach.” So קָרַב is a noun form built from the verb Exodus 17:7Psalm 103:1 יִשְׁבֵּי הָאָרֶץ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big אֶרֶץ hebrew Meaning: * Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country The word אֶרֶץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground. When coupled with heavens (שָׁמַיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1 כִּי לֹא הוֹרִישׁוּ
ESV	so the Asherites lived among the Canaanites, the inhabitants of the land, for they did not drive them out.
NIV	and because of this the people of Asher lived among the Canaanite inhabitants of the land.
NLT	Instead, the people of Asher moved in among the Canaanites, who controlled the land, for they failed to drive them out.
