Hebrew	אֶת hebrew The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּרָא אֱלֹהִים (יִשְׂרָאֵל אֲבָצָן מִבֵּית לָחֶם
	ESV After him Ibzan of Bethlehem judged Israel.
	NIV After him, Ibzan of Bethlehem led Israel.
	NLT After Jephthah died, Ibzan from Bethlehem judged Israel.
	καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἔκρινεν μετ αὐτὸν greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) τὸν greek The definite article Ἰσραηλ Εσεβων ἐκ Βαιθλεεμ
