In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. ESV	Now Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lappidoth, was judging Israel at that time.
NIV	Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time.
NLT	Deborah, the wife of Lappidoth, was a prophet who was judging Israel at that time.
