	הִיָּה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigהִיָּה hebrew The word הִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 אֲדֹנָי לֹא צִוָּה
ESV	Who has spoken and it came to pass, unless the Lord has commanded it?
NIV	Who can speak and have it happen if the Lord has not decreed it?
NLT	Who can command things to happen without the Lord's permission?
LXX	τίς οὕτως εἶπεν καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐγενήθη κύριος οὐκ ἐνετείλατο
