NIV	But if water has been put on the seed and a carcass falls on it, it is unclean for you.

LXX	ἐάν δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἐπεχυσθῇ ὕδωρ ἐπὶ πάν greek Meaning * All * Every * The whole Adjective. Usage in the New Testament The sense of πάν depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἀκάθαρτόν ἐστιν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὑμῖν
