Hebrew	The word יהיה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בָּקָרְחַת אוּ בַנְּחֻתִי אוּ בַקְרָחַתִּי הוּא צִרְעַת פְּרִיחַת הוּא בְּקָרְחַתִּי אוּ בַנְּחֻתִי
ESV	But if there is on the bald head or the bald forehead a reddish-white diseased area, it is a leprous disease breaking out on his bald head or his bald forehead.
NIV	But if he has a reddish-white sore on his bald head or forehead, it is an infectious disease breaking out on his head or forehead.
NLT	However, if a reddish white sore appears on the bald area at the top or back of his head, this is a skin disease.

	ἐὼν δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. γένηται ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ἐν greek Meaning: * The The definite article. It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
