ESV	He shall remain unclean as long as he has the disease. He is unclean. He shall live alone. His dwelling shall be outside the camp.
NIV	As long as he has the infection he remains unclean. He must live alone; he must live outside the camp.
NLT	As long as the serious disease lasts, they will be ceremonially unclean. They must live in isolation in their place outside the camp.
