NIV The clothing, or the woven or knitted material, or any leather article that has been washed and is rid of the mildew, must be washed again, and it will be clean."

NLT But if the spot disappears from the clothing, the fabric, or the leather article after it has been washed, it must be washed again; then it will be ceremonially clean.

The sense of \pi \tilde{\alpha} c depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

it is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning πλυθήσεται καιριμαία-autotooltip_default plugin-autotooltip_default
