	אתָּplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The Hebrew אתָּ word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרֵא אֱלֹהִים (אֶצְבְּעוּ הַיָּמִינִית מִן הַשָּׁמַיִם אֲשֶׁר עַל) plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הָיוּ?
Hebrew	hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament. It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
